Construction Safety Report

Construction Safety Management Overview

The construction Contracts for Prop H work list requirements that the awarded Contractors are to follow:

- 1) Provide a Company Injury, Illness and Protection Program for the specific project.
- 2) Provide all safeguards and supervision to prevent safety incidents from occurring during the course of construction.
- 3) Provide Insurance certificates and indemnity naming the Construction Manager and School District as additionally insured.

The Construction Manager monitors the Contractors' Safety Program and reports to the contractor the effectiveness of the implementation. Further, a third party Safety Consultant visits construction sites and performs a safety audit. This audit identifies deficiencies involving safety, security and daily clean-up activities.

Safety Data

The data collected encompasses both audit information and actual contractor incidents. During the past 12 months, there have been no incidents involving more than standard first aid.

As such to date, the total cumulative incidents involved in the Prop H program stands at three. These incidents occurred at the onset of the program with two occurring during the third quarter and another one during the fourth quarter of 2005. Since that time no incidents have been recorded.

There have been eight consultant audits during the last three quarters. These audits have identified path of travel, fencing, clean up and signage issues on the active campuses. Additionally, 30 safety notices have been issued. These notices specifically identify immediate safety issues that are not in compliance with contractual or contractor's safety program requirements. These notices detailed four trenching, 12 fencing, 12 housekeeping, and two welding issues. The contractors complied immediately as a result of these notices.

(OSHA) incident/injury rate compared to the Bureau of Labor Statistics national standards for employee injuries working heavy construction. **Statistical rates for heavy construction recently changed from 6.5 to 5.5 in January of 2007 based on recent information provided by the Bureau of labor and OSHA.**
